A letter from the Rector "The true meaning of Christmas"

Christmas is a time of celebration and music when we dust off our carol books and look forward to candle-lit services in churches and other settings within communities where we live.

How well do you know the Christmas carols that we return to year after year? I wonder if you know the titles of all the carols that contain these lines:

"Peace on earth and mercy mild, God and sinners reconciled. "

"Peace on earth, good will to men, from heaven's all gracious King"

"O tidings of comfort and joy"

"Be near me Lord Jesus; I ask thee to stay. Close by me forever, and love me, I pray"

"O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Emmanuel"

The words found in our Christmas carols are wonderfully expressive of the true meaning of Christmas; that God in Jesus Christ has come to us, to be near to us, to bring us closer to God. The images that we hold onto in our hearts and minds of the mother and child of Bethlehem remind us of this extraordinary truth that Jesus came to us in the vulnerability of an infant, born in a lowly stable, into hardship away from home. As we hurtle towards the festive season, your band of volunteers working on a Neighbourhood plan for the parish of Buxton with Lamas* are hard at work!

We have been reviewing dozens of comments made during the "Regulation 14 Consultation" held earlier this year. It is a huge amount of work. If we added up the hours, it equates to weeks and weeks of hard work by the volunteers, people living in the parish, and our consultant who is paid via national funding.

We are nearing the end. But there's still lots of work to do to finalise a few more documents, update the Plan, proofread it and submit it to Broadland District Council (BDC). We hope to do this as soon in the New Year as possible.

After submission, responsibility for taking the process forward lies with BDC. They will publicise the plan (Regulation 16) and arrange for an independent examination. This will consider whether the neighbourhood plan meets the basic conditions and other legal requirements.

If successful at the examination stage, with modifications if necessary, then the local authority will arrange for a neighbourhood plan referendum in our parish. If there is a majority yes vote, then the neighbourhood plan is "made" and becomes part of the statutory development plan for the area.

The Neighbourhood Plan is a planning document solely for our parish. It works alongside all the district/regional and national planning policies. Its aim is to safeguard the parts and assets of our villages that we treasure and facilitate good quality development in the right places if the need arises. We'll keep you posted!

The parish of Buxton with Lamas covers four settlements: Buxton, Lammas, Little Hautbois and a small part of Badersfield (the former officers' housing).



From our Nature Correspondent

Something particularly special has happened this winter. The aurora, which is usually only visible near the poles, has been spotted in Norfolk!

The aurora is caused by solar wind, the stream of plasma particles released from the sun. The earth's magnetic field usually deflects most of this plasma, but some particles break through at the poles where the magnetic field is weakest. Gas particles in the atmosphere absorb the energy and release it as photons (particles of coloured light) which form the aurora borealis (when it occurs near the north pole) or the aurora australis (when it occurs near the south pole). The green and red lights are caused by oxygen gas, while nitrogen tends to produce blue light.

The aurora is more visible this year because the current solar cycle is producing more solar wind, causing plasma to break through our magnetic field further away from the poles. In the past, even if the aurora was visible in Norfolk, vou could only see properly by using a camera lens to reveal the colour, but this year there have been reports of people witnessing it with the naked eye. The solar wind is going to become more powerful until 2025 so this could be one of the best years to witness this amazing light display without having to travel to the artic circle. So far, I have not been lucky enough to see it but please let me know if any of you have managed to capture some footage of this phenomenal natural event.

Now Christmas is on the way, and, as I did last year, I wanted to share a nature related festive tale. So allow me to introduce you to one species that has more associations with Christmas than any other: the holly tree.

The holly tree has a close association with Christ, as holly berries were originally believed to be white but, after the plant was used to make his crown of thorns, the berries became red with Christ's blood. However, there is another story including the holly that has closer ties to Christmas.

After Christ was born, King Herod ordered every child in Bethlehem to be killed in an attempt to destroy him. While fleeing the city, Mary, Joseph, and baby Jesus hid from the Roman soldiers by a holly tree which lowered its boughs to hide them. When she realized she was safe, Mary blessed the tree, causing it to remain green all year long.

Holly trees are indeed evergreen, meaning they do not lose their leaves in winter like deciduous This allows them to photosynthesizing all year and has led to them being associated with everlasting life. Holly trees are also expert protectors as their leaves are spiky close to the ground, with the area inside them being an ideal place for hedgehogs to hibernate. Humans have a tradition of using the holly for protection as well, as bringing a bough or wreath of holly into the house was considered to be good luck, while cutting down a holly tree was considered deeply unlucky. The holly is also a dioecious tree, meaning it has different male and female forms, the female tree being the one to produce berries which, though toxic to humans, are a hugely important winter food source for birds.

I like to think that the holly gives us hope in the dark of winter, when most other trees are bare, because it reminds us that spring will return. Nature plays an important role in many of our traditional stories, showing how important it has been to us throughout all of human history, and the story of the holly tree is a particularly special one because it reminds us that even at this time of year, when the weather is harsh and cold, nature will always protect and provide for us.




